





- Students must either waive out with proof of insurance or enroll in the student insurance plan at bcbsnc.com/student.
- If the student does not waive out by Sept 10, \$1,392.40 per semester will be billed to the student's University account.

UNC Sponsored Insurance Plan

Administered by Blue Cross Blue Shield of North Carolina



- Plan covers most charges at Campus Health and is accepted worldwide.
- Coverage dates:
 - August 1st December 31st
 - January 1st July 31st
- Charges incurred outside of Campus Health are subject to deductibles, co-pays, and coinsurance.


